CALL FOR NOMINATION 2010 THE EUROPEAN BRISTOL-MYERS SQUIBB

The EUROPEAN BMS PREVENTION AWARD IN PSYCHIATRY

has been established to recognize distinguished research in the field of prevention in psychiatric disorders, including psychosis, depression, anxiety and dementia.

This award will be granted during the European Congress of Psychiatry.

The winner will be awarded with 20,000 euros for scientific purposes at his or her institution and is invited to present the award lecture during the 18th European Congress of Psychiatry in Munich, Germany, on 27 February 2010.

Who can apply?

- Psychiatrists or scientists working in psychiatric fields and related disciplines such as public health or pharmacology
- The applicants must have developed a tool strategy for early recognition; early intervention or early treatment is psychiatric prevention, enabling pathways to the manifestation of the disease that could be identified target for early intervention
- The award scheme is open to citizens of European countries (continent of Europe including Russia, Turkey and Israel), affiliated with a university, research institution or hospital, whose research originates primarily in Europe

Applicants must

- Have a doctorate degree (MD or PhD)
- Have less than 18 years of experience in research in the year of the congress
- Be engaged in clinical or basic research, training or teaching activities in the field of prevention of psychiatric disorders

How to apply?

Applicants should submit the following documents in 10 copies:

- a detailed letter of application, highlighting the rationale for application
- a Curriculum Vitae
- the application form downloadable at EPA website (www.europsy.net)
- at least 3 published articles representing the work of the applicant

- a summary, 4 double-spaced typed pages maximum, detailing the research work, and its significance, innovative aspects and possible future consequences in the field of prevention

All documents must be submitted in English.
Back-to-back printing recommended.
Do not staple documents.
