The European Psychiatric Association announces its Scholarship Programme 2010 for up to 5 young psychiatrists and trainees

The Scholarship Programme 2010 includes:

- Congress registration fee exemption to the 18th European Congress of Psychiatry, organised by EPA in Munich Germany, from 27 February to 2 March 2010
- Travel to and from the congress venue
- Up to 4 nights hotel
- Free access to one Academia CME course
- Invitation to attend the Congress opening ceremony
- Invitation to the Alumni Mentor Luncheon
- EPA membership fee waived for 2010

Eligibility:

Young psychiatrists who are either trainees or within 5 years of completion of specialist training in psychiatry, and who are working in countries that form part of the World Health Organisation Europe region.

How to apply:

The decisions will be made on the basis of an application file submitting the following documents in 9 paper copies:

1. Application form and CV (to be downloaded on www.europsy.net)
2. Reference of a institution (either training institution or National Psychiatric association)
3. Essay of 500 words about possible past remarkable contributions to the field of psychiatry and/or EPA and expected contribution to the field of psychiatry and/or EPA in the future

All documents must be submitted in English. Candidates will not be penalised if this is their second language.

Electronic submissions will not be considered.

Back-to-back printing recommended.

Do not staple documents.
